This line features many native plants suitable for rain gardens, wetland reclamation and/or naturalizing areas. All plants listed in the Natives section are grown without the use of neonicotinoid insecticides.

Achillea millefolium

Common Yarrow ○

Zone 3-8 H 12-18" x W 18-24" June-July white
Common yarrow is a perennial herb that produces flattened, dome shaped, white flower heads atop of fern-like leaves. Adaptable to various soil conditions.

Agastache foeniculum

Lavender Hyssop ○◎

Zone 4-8 H 1-3' x W 12-18" July-Sept purple
This plant produces bright purple flowers atop of textured foliage. When leaves are crushed they have a fragrance of mint and licorice. Self-sows on open soil. Dry to medium soils.

Allium cernuum

Nodding Pink Onion ○

Zone 4-8 H 1-2' x W 8-12" July-Aug pink
This long lived and super hardy Allium produces a vase-like rosette that gives way to nodding clusters of whitish pink flowers. Foliage gives off onion-like scent. Dry to moist soils.

Prairie Onion ○

Zone 4-8 H 1-2' x W 8-12" July-Aug pink
Onion scented foliage produces a round umbel of reddish pink flowers in mid to late summer. Hardy and adaptable. Dry to moist soils.

Leadplant ○

Zone 4-8 H 2-3' x W 18-24" June-July purple
Extremely long lived and drought tolerant, leadplant produces purple spikes atop of delicate silver-gray foliage in the heat of mid-summer. Thrives in well-drained soil.

Anemone canadensis

Canada Anemone ○◎

Zone 3-6 H 12-18" x W 12-18" May-June white
A native groundcover that fills in rapidly with medium green foliage and white flowers in spring. Medium to moist soils.

Columbine ○●

Zone 4-8 H 1-2' x W 1-2' May-June red
A spring flowering native producing a multitude of nodding, red flowers with a yellow interior. Adaptable to sun or shade. Dry to medium soils.

Arisaema triphyllum

Jack In The Pulpit ◎●

Zone 3-8 H 16-20" x W 12-15" May-June green/brown
This woodland native produces a unique, hooded, green and brown flower in spring. The spring flower produces a cluster of bright red berries in late summer. Plants go dormant by late summer.

Asclepias incarnata

Swamp Milkweed ○

Zone 3-8 H 3-5' x W 18-24" June-July red
This milkweed is an erect, clump forming native plant. It forms small fragrant pink to mauve flowers that appear in tight clusters followed by attractive seed pods. Thrives along ponds and streams. Attracts butterflies.

Prairie Milkweed ○

Zone 4-8 H 30-36" x W 18-24" June-Aug pink
Similar to common milkweed, but much less aggressively spreading. Fragrant, pink flowers with white bases attract pollinators. Medium to moist soils.

Asclepias tuberosa

Butterfly Weed ○

Zone 4-8 H 18-24" x W 12-18" June-Aug orange
Attractive native prairie plant. Tap rooted and drought tolerant, this plant excels during summer heat. Bright orange flowers attract pollinators. Dry to medium soils, needs well drained soils.

Aster ericoides (syn. *Symphotrichum ericoides*)

Heath Aster ○

Zone 3-8 H 18-36" x W 2-3' Aug-Oct white
This aster produces a blizzard of bright white flowers in early fall. Grows well on sandy and gravelly soils. Slow creeping, forming a small bush like plant.

Smooth Aster ○

Zone 4-8 H 2-4' x W 18-24" Aug-Oct blue
This aster produces a profusion of deep blue, star-like flowers in late summer and autumn. Extremely hardy, grows in almost any soil.

New England Aster ○◎

Zone 4-8 H 3-5' x W 2-3' Aug-Oct purple-pink
Deep pink to purple flowers highlight this aster. Late bloomer that provides nectar for butterflies. Medium to wet soils.

Sky Blue Aster ○◎

Zone 3-8 H 2-3' x W 18-24" Aug-Oct blue
A medium sized aster for well drained soils. Gorgeous late season blue to blue violet flowers are very attractive to pollinators. Medium to dry soils.

White False Indigo ○◎

Zone 4-9 H 3-4' x W 3-4' June-July white
Rapidly growing in spring with blue green leaves and charcoal gray stems. White flowers attract bumblebees, foliage provides food for larvae of several butterfly species. Widely adaptable for dry to moist soils.

Baptisia australis

Blue False Indigo ○●

Zone 3-8 H 3-4' x W 3-4' June-July blue
Blue-green leaves and strong sturdy stems with long tapering spikes of indigo-blue pea-shaped flowers in early summer. Its green seedpods turn black in the fall and winter for added interest. Slow growing at first, but long lived. Medium to moist soils.

Caltha palustris

Marsh Marigold ○●

Zone 4-8 H 1-2' x W 12-18" April-June yellow
In early spring, bright yellow, buttercup flowers dot the green cordate foliage. Grows well along marshes, swamps and wet meadows. Deer usually leave it alone.

New Jersey Tea ○●

Zone 3-8 H 2-3' x W 2-3' July-Aug white
This durable shrub has luxuriant glossy leaves with bright white flowers. Drought tolerant. Attracts hummingbirds. Dry to medium soils.

White Turtlehead ○●

Zone 3-8 H 2-3' x W 18-24" July-Sept white
Dense spikes of creamy white flowers atop dark green foliage. Medium to moist soils.

Lanceleaf Coreopsis ○

Zone 4-8 H 1-2' x W 1-2' June-Aug yellow
Bright yellow flowers in late spring and early summer. May spread to form colonies in favorable situations. Dry soils.

Prairie Coreopsis ○

Zone 4-8 H 2-3' x W 18-24" July-Aug yellow
Beautiful bright yellow flowers cover dense foliage in mid-summer. Grows well in difficult dry soils, excellent for stabilizing dry sunny slopes and sand dunes.

Dalea purpurea

Purple Prairie Clover ○

Zone 4-8 H 1-2' x W 12-16" July-Aug purple
Gorgeous purple and gold flowers atop of elegant foliage. Heat and drought tolerant. Dry to medium soils.

Shooting Star ○●

Zone 4-8 H 12-16" x W 12-16" April-June pink
A beautiful, graceful spring blooming wildflower featuring a cluster of delicate, nodding flowers that can range in color from almost purple to pink to white. After flowering in spring, foliage goes dormant until the following spring. Dry to moist soils.

Pale Purple Coneflower ○

Zone 4-8 H 3-5' x W 18-24" June-July purple
This coneflower has long, narrow basal leaves that produce tall showy flowers with drooping, pale purple petals and a purplish brown, cone shaped central disk. Medium to dry soils.

Zone 4-8 H 3-4' x W 18-24" July-Sept purple
A showy native producing large flowers from mid to late summer. Pollinators are attracted to the flowers, birds utilize the seeds. Medium to moist soils.

Eryngium yuccifolium

Rattlesnake Master ○

Zone 4-8 H 3-5' x W 30-36" July-Aug white
This plant has beautiful thick, yucca-like, basal leaves with parallel veins and soft or weak prickles spaced far apart along the edges. Round, white flower heads are on stout peduncles at the tip of the stem. Medium to moist soils.

Zone 3-8 H 4-6' x W 30-36" Aug-Sept pink
Joe Pye Weed produces clusters of bright pink flowers in late summer. Very good for attracting late season butterflies. Prefers moist to wet soils.

Wild Geranium ○●

Zone 3-8 H 12-18" x W 18-24" May-June purple
Delicate, dissected leaves produce pinkish purple flowers in spring. Provides an early season nectar source for pollinators. Medium to moist soils, sun or shade.

Prairie Smoke ○

Zone 4-8 H 8-10" x W 12-18" May-June pink
Nodding, pink, bell shaped flowers and unique, feathery pink seed heads make this a star of the spring prairie garden. Slow spreading ground cover that grows well in medium to dry soils.

Zone 4-8 H 4-6' x W 30-36" June-Sept yellow
Produces a profusion of bright yellow flowers. Excellent for problem clay soils. Medium to moist soils.

Zone 3-8 H 2-3' x W 18-24" June-July blue

Zone 4-8 H 2-4' x W 16-20" Aug-Sept purple
Wands of lavender flowers cover this plant. Grows in dry sandy soils to well-drained loams. Makes an excellent dried flower, and goldfinches love the seeds!

Zone 4-8 H 3-5' x W 16-20" Aug-Sept reddish purple
This plant produces large spikes with short branched, reddish pink flowers. Attracts butterflies and birds. Medium to moist soils. Quite possibly the best flower for attracting late season monarchs.

Zone 3-8 H 16-20" x W 12-15" April-May blue
An early spring blooming woodland native with pink buds that open to sky blue flowers. Long-lived plants will form large clumps over time. Plants go completely dormant by mid summer.

Zone 3-8 H 2-4' x W 18-24" July-Sept lavender
Grey-green foliage with tubular lavender flowers. Dry to moist soils.

Zone 4-8 H 5-10' x W 2-3' July-Sept yellow

White Trillium ☉●

Zone 3-8 H 12-15" x W 10-12" April-June white
An iconic resident of northern woodlands, Trillium produces a three-petaled, snow white flower in early spring. Flowers take on pink shades as they age. Plants go dormant by mid summer, waiting until the following spring to grow and bloom again.

Zone 4-8 H 3-5' x W 18-24" July-Sept blue
Blooms from mid to late summer on multiple 2-6" long spikes of purplish blue flowers. Stiff, upright, clump forming habit. Medium to wet soils.

Zone 4-8 H 2-4' x W 12-18" July-Sept lavender blue
Lavender blue spires in late summer, very drought resistant, it thrives in dry soils and well-drained loamy soils.

Zone 4-8 H 2-3' x W 12-18" April-June yellow

Andropogon gerardii

Big Bluestem ○

Zone 3-8 H 4-6' x W 2-3' Aug-Oct purplish
Big bluestem is a tall perennial grass that was once the dominant grass of the Midwest. The attractive foliage changes color seasonally, has great height and interesting flower/seed heads. Dry to moist soils.

Blue Joint Grass ○◎

Zone 4-8 H 3-4' x W 2-3' June-July tan
Blue Joint is a long lived, perennial grass with stout stems and narrow panicles. Medium to wet soils.

Copper Shouldered Oval Sedge ○

Zone 4-8 H 2-3' x W 12-18" May-June yellow-green
This sedge greens up early in the spring; coppery colored seed heads appear in summer. Good drought tolerance. Medium to dry soils.

Bottlebrush Sedge ○

Zone 4-8 H 2-3' x W 18-24" May-June yellow-green

Zone 3-8 H 2-3' x W 18-24" June-July yellow-green
A more upright growing sedge with leaves that radiate from the stem similar to a palm frond. Thrives in partially shaded areas. Moist to medium soils.

Zone 3-8 H 8-12" x W 12-16" May-June yellow-green
This native plant has bright green, narrow, slightly arching blades. An upland sedge tolerant of dry soils. Dry to medium soils.

Zone 4-8 H 2-3' x W 18-24" May-June yellow-green
This carex forms dense tussocks of straw-color leaves at the base with bright green new growth emerging from the top. Moist to wet soils.

Zone 3-8 H 2-3' x W 18-24" May-June yellow-green
This lovely sedge grows into a clump form, producing brownish-yellow seed heads from the center. Very adaptable, will grow in medium dry to wet soils.

Zone 4-8 H 3-4' x W 24-30" Aug-Sept tan
A widely adaptable grass with nodding, wheat-like seed heads that will grow in sun or shade. Medium to moist soils.

Bottlebrush Grass ○●

Zone 4-8 H 3-4' x W 18-24" June-Aug tan
Bottlebrush grass is a cool season grass that produces exquisite seed heads resembling a bottlebrush. Perfect for planting under oaks and other deciduous trees. Medium to moist soils.

This early flowering gem produces lustrous silver-green seed heads in early summer. Best in dry soils.

Scripus atrovirens

Green Bulrush ○

Zone 3-8 H 4-5' x W 24-30" June-Aug brown

A wetland native with tall, stiff stems. Moist to wet soils, will tolerate standing water.
